

What is VIDARIS?

Certain medical conditions can affect the eyes' ability to properly lubricate the corneal surface. The application of serum eye drops may help alleviate discomfort from dry eyes.



VIDARIS is eye drops derived from the patient's own blood serum that nourishes the eye like natural tears. Research findings suggest that ASED may have a therapeutic advantage because they contain biological components naturally found in healthy tears.

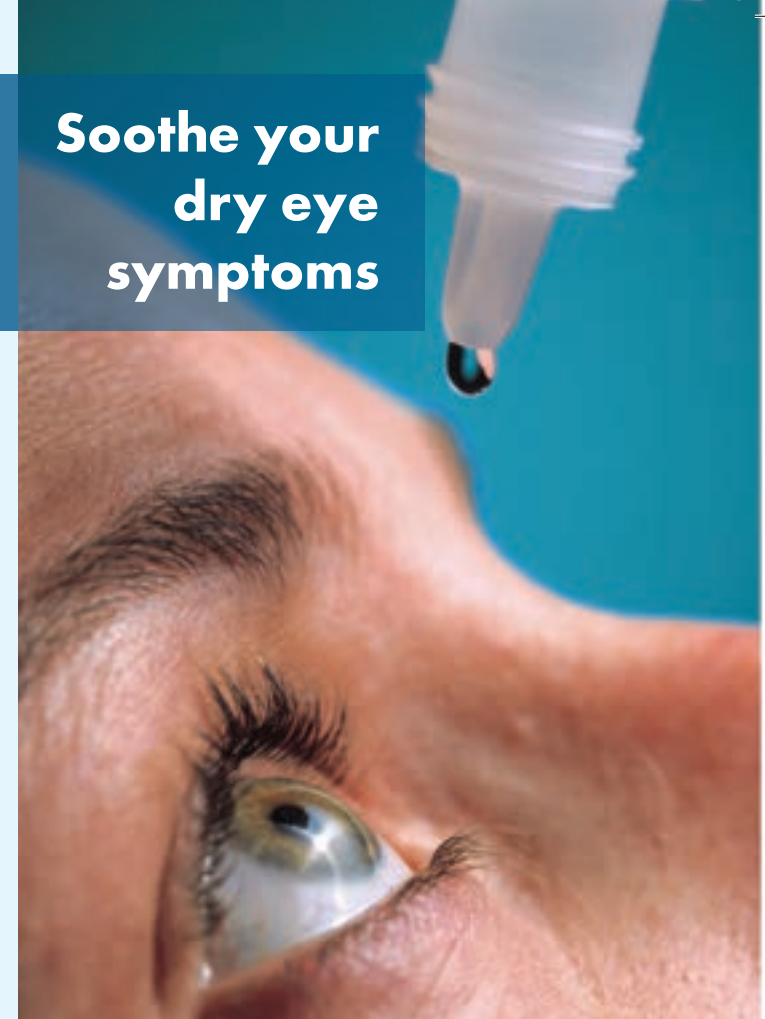

How Do I Get Started?

Speak With Your Physician



If VIDARIS is a recommended therapy, your physician will initiate the process by submitting an order. Our team will contact you upon receipt of the order.

Prepare For Your Blood Draw



To ensure you provide an adequate blood specimen for VIDARIS, at least 24 hrs prior to blood draw, drink plenty of water and avoid diuretics such as caffeine and alcohol.

Receive Your Delivery Update



For the safety of our patients, every batch of eye drops undergoes a 14-day sterility test to ensure it is free of contaminants. You will be contacted by our team when your VIDARIS order is ready for delivery.

Unpack Your Serum Eye Drops



All eye drops will be packaged on dry ice to ensure they remain frozen during transport. Place one bottle in the refrigerator to completely thaw out for use and place the rest in the freezer.



VIDARIS FAQ

How much blood is drawn?

The lab will draw approximately 100 mL of blood. For reference, when donating blood, you give approximately 475 mL of blood.

Can eye drops be shared with another person?

The serum eye drops are intended solely for the patient whose blood they were derived from and should NOT be used by anyone else to eliminate the risk of disease transmission.

Why did I receive a different number of bottles than last time?

The number of bottles received depends on the amount of serum extracted from the blood. A change in prescription may also affect the number of bottles received.
